

System fact sheet

Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare (WFH), a division of Wheaton Franciscan Services, Inc., is a Catholic, not-for-profit organization with more than 100 sites in Wisconsin, Iowa, and Illinois including 17 hospitals, four transitional and extended care facilities, two home health agencies, more than 3,700 physicians, 70 clinic sites with approximately 700 employed physicians, and nearly 22,000 associates. Started more than 125 years ago and formally incorporated in 1983, WFH is sponsored by the Wheaton Franciscan Sisters. The organization has corporate offices Wheaton, Illinois and Glendale, Wisconsin and is led by John D. Oliverio, President and Chief Executive Officer, and Michael Murry, Chair of the Board of Directors.

Wheaton Franciscan Services, Inc. also operates a housing division known as Franciscan Ministries, Inc. with 2,681 units of assisted living and other housing.

As a not-for-profit organization, Wheaton Franciscan Services, Inc. reinvests all of its net income into the communities it serves. Its health care ministry Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare is dedicated to delivering quality to patients through advanced technology, highly-trained staff, and superior and compassionate service; caring for each person's body, mind and spirit with respect and dignity; working to improve the health of the communities it serves; and ensuring health care access for everyone. Its housing ministry, Franciscan Ministries, Inc., concentrates on communities where housing is needed for low-income families, the elderly and residents with special needs.

Health Care Mission:

Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare is committed to living out the healing ministry of Jesus by providing exceptional and compassionate health care service that promotes the dignity and well being of the people we serve.

Housing Mission:

Franciscan Ministries, Inc. is committed to providing quality affordable housing in a compassionate environment that promotes wholeness of life within ourselves and the communities we serve.

Health Care Vision:

Our health ministries will be recognized in each community we serve for superior and compassionate patient service, clinical excellence, as the health care employer of choice and the preferred partner of physicians.

Housing Vision:

Our housing ministries will be recognized for excellence in property management and a well-integrated network of support services that provide hope, growth and opportunity.

Values:

Our Values, which flow from our Mission and Catholic tradition, must have meaning for every one of us. Through them we put the healing ministry of Jesus and human and community development into practice throughout the organization. We hope these behaviors will influence for the better every person whose life we touch.

Composition: Wheaton Franciscan Services, Inc. includes:

- nearly 22,000 associates
- 2,681 units of assisted living and other housing for fixed-income elderly, low-income families and those with special needs
- joint ventures, including MRI centers, dialysis centers, industrial medicine services, and physician partnerships

Structure: Wheaton Franciscan Services, Inc. is the legal name of the entire corporation. Within the organization, there is the housing ministry, which is legally named Franciscan Ministries, Inc. The health care ministry uses the “doing business as” name of Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare.

Franciscan Ministries has housing locations in Colorado, Illinois, Iowa and Wisconsin. Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare has health care organizations in Wisconsin, Iowa and Illinois. Specifically, its hospitals include:

Community impact: In fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the organizations of Wheaton Franciscan Services, Inc. contributed more than \$135.1 million to the communities they serve, including the cost of charity care, Medicaid shortfalls, non-billed community services, cash and in-kind donations, education of health professionals, and research activities.

Financials: For the year ending June 30, 2009, the System's operations resulted in assets of \$2.341 billion, net assets of \$703 million and revenues of \$2.03 billion.
